

LATIN IN CHURCH! SHEET 2

Verbs are doing words.

Do, dare is the Latin verb meaning 'to give'. Pronounce this *doh, da-ray*.

The verb 'to give' goes like this in English and like this in Latin:

I give	do
thou givest	das
he gives	dat
we give	damus
you give	datis
they give	dant

Use that pattern to work out the other bits in the verb *amo, amare* (to love)

I love	amo
thou	amas
he	
we	
you	
they	

Now do the same for *pugno pugnare* (to fight) and *volo volare* (to fly)

pugno	volo

Here are some words you can put after those verbs:

English	Latin	English	Latin
Me	me	to me	mihi
thee	te	to thee	tibi
us	nos	to us	nobis
you	vos	to you	vobis
gift	donum	food	escam
war	bellum	nothing	nil

Here are some words you can put before the verbs:

English	Latin	English	Latin
God	Deus	Lord	Dominus
boys	pueri	angeli	angels

Write these sentences in Latin:

God gives food to us

The Lord loves me

I love thee

I give a gift to you.....

God loves you

The boys fight.....

The angels fly

Mandatum novum do vobis, dicit Dominus

(A) new commandment I give to you, says (the) Lord
