VICAR'S LETTER

I hope that some of you will be reading this before New Year's Eve, as I would like to remind you that as Midnight strikes and the New Year begins there will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament in LSM; we pray that the hopes and longings of God's people and God's world will be fulfilled through Jesus who came, who comes and who will come, as Br Reginald reminded us during our Advent Quiet Weekend, to fill our emptiness. Later at 10.30am Mass on January 1st, we shall celebrate the Holy Name of Jesus, the Name which signifies and makes present Salvation. Thus in His Name, and rejoicing in His presence, we begin another year.

The Feast of the Epiphany, on Saturday January 6th, will be especially exciting for my family this year, as my eldest daughter Kate is to be married in LSM at 2_30pm; but, just as important for all of us, in the morning (10am), there will be the High Mass which will begin with the Blessing of the Epiphany House; in our procession and our prayers we join with the Wise Men to offer all that we are to the Christ Child. We might make a connection between the symbolism of the Magi and their gifts and the Stewardship Renewal which begins later in the month; what we offer in time and resources within the life of the Church here is to be given in joyful response to God's generous love to us, manifested above all in the Word made flesh. Stewardship letters will be sent out to all regular members of the congregation during January, and the sermon at High Mass on Sunday January 28th will be on this theme.

The day after Epiphany, Sunday January 7th, we shall be having a very happy LSM occasion; two past Lay Pastoral Assistants, David and Rachel (neeGreene) Neaum, who were married in David's home Diocese in Australia last July, will be renewing their marriage vows in the presence of our congregation and other Cambridge friends. As this is also the Feast of Our Lord's Baptism, the rest of us will also be renewing vows, those made for us, or by us, at our Baptism. Once more, we turn to Christ,

Between Epiphany and our Stewardship Sunday come first our Holy Land Pilgrimage, and then the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. Graham Ward is leading our group of twelve on the pilgrimage, during which we shall be staying three nights at Tiberias and four in Jerusalem; I hope you will remember us (and indeed the troubled Holy Land) in your prayers. I feel very privileged to be able to

make this trip, but I'm sorry (for the second year in a row) to be missing our Epiphany Carol Service (Sunday 14th at 6pm), in which we are reminded that Jesus is 'manifested' not only to the wise men with their gifts, but also to the people gathered at the Jordan where he was baptized (This is my beloved Son), and to the guests at the wedding at Cana in Galilee. The service concludes with Benediction, in which Jesus is 'manifested' to us in His Sacramental Presence. I'm very grateful to Fr Mark for looking after this service again, as to the Parish and Junior Choirs who will be joining forces as they did for the Advent Carol Service. From January 1st, Robin Osborne will have tickets for the Supper which follows the Epiphany Carol Service. As for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, (January 18th-25th) arrangements are different this year. There will be NO Sunday evening ecumenical service (some of you will remember that we had a Sunday afternoon service at LSM on the Feast of Christ the King), but there is to be a lunch-time service at St Columba's United Reformed Church on Wednesday January 24th, at 12.30pm. Lunch will be provided afterwards. I hope that many of you will be able to support this new venture. At LSM, we shall have the Minister of Emmanuel URC, Dr Lance Stone, as our preacher at the High Mass on Sunday January 21", and we are invited to a Bring-and-Share Lunch at Emmanuel afterwards.

So there's plenty for our January diaries...and, when you buy your LSM Calendar for 2007 (many thanks to David Stone for his work on it, and to Diana Galletly for the photograph on the front), you will find plenty more to interest and involve us in the remaining 11 months! I'll mention just two things for the moment. First, may I encourage you once again to consider participating in the visit to Chant d'Oiseau after Easter. Despite several (too many?!) reminders and appeals there has not been a great deal of interest so far; if you've got comments, questions or reservations about this long-standing and important ecumenical link, and how this visit will further it, do please put them to me! Second, please note that from Monday April 30th to Sunday May 27th we are enthusiastically celebrating the new Organ, with episcopal visits (David Conner, to dedicate the instrument on April 30th, and John Inge, Bishop of Huntingdon, to preach on May 20th) and musical events beginning with Thomas Trotter's Organ Recital on Saturday May 5th, Look out for the full programme in a few weeks' time. We hope to bid farewell to our electronic standin at some point during February, as work on installing the new organ should begin towards the end of January (and is likely to take three weeks).

CHARITY LUNCH, January/February: Cambridge Money Advice Centre

LSM will be supporting the Cambridge Money Advice Centre (MAC) at the Charity Lunches in January and February and Alison Boddington from the Centre will be at the lunch on 26th January to talk about their work A display will also be mounted. The Social Responsibly Group commends their work to members of the congregation. They were impressed by their professionalism and commitment in an area where many charities are having to turn people in need of help away.

MAC is a charity, run by Christians, providing free money advice to ANYONE in financial difficulties. They walk alongside people as they seek to become debt free.

Approximately three years ago 4 people from two different churches met to discuss a concern for people in debt which seems to be one of our society's greatest problems, with individuals borrowing more and more on credit and bankruptcy being at an all time high. Debt affects people of all ages, incomes and background and has a crippling effect on individuals and families. Financial worry is cited as one of the biggest causes of family breakdown in the UK. God asks us to care for the broken and to help to break the chains that bind people.

Three years later, MAC is a busy centre with up to 20 volunteers from 6 different churches providing both advisory support and essential administrative work. When a client arrives a financial statement is created giving a clear understanding of their situation and then, with their agreement, MAC takes over the day to day handling of their debt. Just to hand over the many demand letters they have received gives people a sense of relief. MAC's aim is 'to help people get out and stay out of debt', working with people on budgeting skills and strategies to try and prevent a recurrence. Since opening in May 2005 MAC has helped over 40 people and has a close working relationship with the Citizens Advice Bureau who refer people when they are overbooked.

MAC has been busier than predicted, an indication of just how many people are affected by debt in Cambridge, and are now looking to raise funds to employ a full time administrator by September 2007. There is also a desire for the future to set up training in financial skills for school pupils throughout Cambridge to try to prevent people from getting into debt in the first place.

The aim of MAC will always be to show God's love to people by giving them hope, and helping them to see a future free from debt.
