#### VICAR'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

At the centre of this month in more ways than one is our Patronal Festival. On Wednesday August 15th, the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we shall be welcoming an old friend, Fr Robert Mackley, as our preacher; he is now the Assistant Priest at Liverpool Parish Church. After the High Mass at 7pm, we shall be having a **Buffet Supper**, and the usual list will appear to help us to achieve a balanced menu! A Patronal Festival should be a great day in the life of a parish, and unless we are away on holiday, we should delight in being together to rejoice in the example and the prayers of Mary, so close to Jesus in His earthly life and in the glory and fulfilment of heaven. Early in August (Monday 6<sup>st</sup>) we celebrate another great festival, that of Our Lord's Transfiguration; this is when we celebrate the light of God's glory shining in the human life of Jesus, and recall that, in St Luke's Gospel, Jesus speaks in that mysterious and glorious moment of how He is to accomplish his great work of deliverance ('Exodus') in Jerusalem; the path to the glorious fulfilment of His calling was to be the path of sacrifice, and as for Our Lord, so for us.

Having mentioned these two special festivals, I would like to remind you of the particular contribution which we make to liturgical life here in Cambridge throughout the year, through marking Saints' Days and other festivals with a Sung Mass. Our servers, organists and Parish Choir give generously of their time to make this possible (and indeed so did the Junior Choir on St Peter's Day, as they may do more in the future when festivals fall on Friday evenings), and it would be encouraging to find more of our Sunday congregation working attendance at weekday festivals into the rhythm of their devotional life.

The pattern of Sunday and weekday worship, Mass and Offices, will continue as usual during August, and I am grateful to College and other local clergy for helping to keep the Daily Mass going. If you take note of the daily 'intentions' on the centre page of the Newsletter, you may often find a topic of particular significance for you and come to Mass that day...or perhaps do so on your birthday, or on the anniversary of your Confirmation. As for Morning and

Evening Prayer, I think it would be true to say that all our Lay Pastoral Assistants and the Ordinands who have come here on placement in recent years have commented on the value of corporate prayer at the beginning of the day and in the evening. It's certainly something which has sustained me over the years of my ministry, and it's always a joy when a visitor or a 'Sunday regular' joins us on those weekdays! Here are a few points to note about our programme in **August**:

**Fusae Takahashi** will be giving a piano recital on Sunday 23<sup>-u</sup>: the programme will include works by Mozart, Schumann and Beethoven.

There's not much more to say as yet about the Parish Room project which I mentioned in last month's Newsletter, except that the group of Diocesan Advisory Committee members who came for an informal discussion with the architect and some PCC representatives made generally encouraging noises! The architect is at present checking measurements and making some adjustments to his proposals, particularly in relation to office provision. It is important that this is done before we move on to making contact with English Heritage

and the many other bodies who have to be consulted. Because of the early deadline for the Newsletter in July, I am writing this before the PCC, which is due to meet on July 17th; the Parish Room proposals may well be mentioned then, and there will certainly be discussion. of our Mission Statement and objectives for the next 12 months. In the wider world of the Church of England and the Anglican Communion, the recent General Synod which met at York 'affirmed' its willingness to engage positively with the unanimous recommendation of the Primates in February 2007 for a process designed to produce a **covenant** for the Anglican Communion'. The process would only be concluded when any definitive text has been duly considered through the synodical processes of the provinces of the Anglican Communion. So it's likely to be a lengthy process! But what lies behind the idea of a Covenant? It is an attempt, in a time of clearly increasing diversity and suspicion between provinces, to provide a common basis on which mutual trust can be rebuilt. The question is whether a written covenant will work more effectively than unwritten 'bonds of affection'. First we have to wait and see how it will be framed.

The 'holiday season' these days is quite lengthy, especially for members of the congregation not tied to school holiday dates. I was aware that many people were going to be away for Gift Day in mid-July, and September too can be a quiet month at LSM. But I'm sure we shall have many visitors over the coming weeks, and I hope that we shall be able to give them a good welcome! When you visit other churches on your holiday travels, do collect ideas for good literature to put at the back of the church; improvement to that kind of material is likely to be one of our 'mission objectives' for the year!

The issue of displaying pictures of recognisable individuals on a website is a sensitive one, and has been exercising the PCC. On the one hand we can give no representative picture of the life of LSM if the pictures on the site include no images of people; on the other various individuals do not desire their image to be available to the world in this way.

The following protocols have been adopted:

Photographs of those under the age of 16 will be shown only with the permission of their parents and on a part of the website protected by a password.

When a photograph is taken of an individual or group at an event, the photographer will be expected to ask the adults involved for permission to use the photo on the open website.

Where photographs are taken of services/events showing large numbers of people, among whom may be some who do not wish photographs of themselves to appear on the website, the Webmaster must respect the wishes of those people and take appropriate action to doctor the group photographs.

Anyone who does not wish to appear in any photograph on the website is asked to make this known to the Webmaster and to anyone taking photographs at LSM events.
