Dear Friends,

On 5th June the ministry offered by LSM is developed in a new and exciting way with the blessing and dedication of our new Parish Centre. On this site since at least the early 12th century a Christian ministry of care and reconciliation has been offered to people. For 200 years a church stood on this spot until it collapsed when our current church was built, and in the 1340s that church was dedicated to our Lady of Grace and St Peter by the Bishop of Ely. Over 650 years later, his successor, Bishop Stephen, blesses and dedicates the Parish Centre as a further development in LSM's Christian ministry. This ministry is something in which we all share as part of our life in the Body of Christ; and so we will all be commissioned by the Bishop into this new ministry as a sign that this is something to which we commit ourselves both as a community and as individuals.

An enormous amount of work has been put into the task of raising money and enthusiasm for this project, and it has been very exciting to see how the vision of this Centre has grown since it was first discussed. It may be that when this project was first thought about in the economic times that we live, some were properly cautious about what might be achieved. But notwithstanding these understandable concerns, this project has always been underpinned by a deep confidence in the Lord; just as Mary said 'yes' to God in faith at the Annunciation, so we are called to say 'yes' to God's call to us in our own time; and this project seemed to be part of God's call to us, as the people of God in this place.

We look forward to all the opportunities that will come for the building of the Kingdom through further outreach into our city and towards more people who may not necessarily come to church or recognise what is to be found here, but who know they have people wherever they may be to serve them and through that service, to serve Him who has sent us.

As we beat the bounds at Rogationtide and went around amongst the people going about their Sunday afternoon lives on Coe Fen and around the Mill Pond, the need for an outward-looking Church that seeks to draw all people into the life of God was emphasised. Let us pray that the ministry of the Parish Centre can play its part in drawing people into that

generous and creative life of God.

People for our prayers: Elaine and Tim Wheatley are having a very difficult time at the moment. Elaine went into Addenbrooke's Hospital at the end of May. She would welcome visits, I know, as would Joan Waton who is also in Addenbrooke's where she is receiving protracted treatment on her knee: she will be there for some weeks further. Lawrence Fletcher continues to be at Brookfields Hospital (Byron Ward). It is always good to see Donald Clough on Sunday mornings and he has recently moved to an Abbey Home where he is very happy. We are sustained by each other and upheld by prayer. Very few of us can make the Christian journey on our own: we need the prayers of others at times to carry us. I know that you will keep all these people, and the others for whom we pray, in your hearts at this time.

And do not forget to pray for Matthew and Toni McMurray who leave us at the end of May to go to their first parish in Blackpool after Matthew's ordination in July. They have played a full part in the life of LSM whilst they have been with us, for which we are very grateful, and we wish them well for their future ministry.
